Hamburg's cultural scene is as diverse as the people who frequent it. International literary classics or modern novels: Altona Theater has both. Or perhaps you'd like it to be a little more chic? Then you can look forward to world-class ballet and operas featuring famous stars at the Hamburg State Opera House. The St. Pauli cult musical "Heiße Ecke" at Schmidts Tivoli, on the other hand, is a musical experience.

Hamburg's cultural landmark for diversity of all kinds is **Kampnagel**. This award-winning "culture factory" presents its own shows and co-productions, including productions from the areas of dance, theatre, performance and music.



The Affenfaust Galerie in Altona is a great address for modern art presented in a former supermarket outlet. In the city centre, the Hamburger **Kunsthalle** is home to the particularly impressive "Collection of Old Masters".

## **Anything but ordinary**

A long drawn-out breakfast is a perfect way to start the day! Berta Emil Richard Schneider serves brunch until the afternoon on weekends, while Café Gnosa is ideal for a stopover. This traditional café is as diverse as the cakes that have been served there since the 1950s.

At **Hobenköök**, you can watch the chefs prepare seasonal



and regional food in the open kitchen, while Jellvfish serves creative, sustainable fish dishes with a star factor. You want to sleep in and still go to the market? No problem, as the St. Pauli Night Market is on until late in the evening – offering typical market stands, regional specialities, and live music.

TIP Portuguese custard tarts from local stores, Indian and Turkish delicacies, or fabulous coffee from the **Speicherstadt** – Hamburg tastes amazing!

## Bar culture AND DANCING

### **Trendy hotspots**

The Reeperbahn is known internationally for its wild and colourful party nights. But there are also lots of other clubs around the city where you can dance the night away.

Hamburg's bar culture offers plenty of options to choose from: enjoy cocktails from a Michelin-starred chef in the **Puzzlebar** or visit the gay bar **Wunderbar**. Hip locals gather at the **M&V Bar**, while dance meets theatre in the **Nachtasyl**.

> On warm summer nights, people not only dance at the clubs, but also at the many open-air events or relax at beach clubs. Whilst planning your trip to Hamburg, it's worth checking out the parties staged by Pink Inc. The locations change but the atmosphere is always infectious!
